Sermon On Monday as it is in Heaven

Matthew 6:9-13 (KJV) / Romans 8:18-23 / Genesis 1:1-2 / Ephesians 2:10

Series Big Idea: THE LORD'S PRAYER IS A DAILY COMPASS, POINTING NOT TO A PLACE WE ARE

GOING, BUT TO A PERSON WE ARE BECOMING.

Sermon Big Idea: DISCIPLESHIP IS LESS ABOUT GETTING FROM EARTH TO HEAVEN THAN GETTING HEAVEN TO EARTH.

^{1.} AS IT IS IN HEAVEN "AS IN HEAVEN, ALSO ON THE EARTH" (MATT. 6:10C; GREEK) SUMMARIZES THE GREAT **LONGING** OF ALL CREATION.

Read

Romans 8:18-23 / 2 Corinthians 5:4

You have made us for Yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You. (Augustine)

Reflect

- Why doesn't Paul say that all creation longs for God?
- Who does Paul say that all creation is longing for?
- What is one part of your life would you like to be improved/renewed?
- What could you do, this week, to bring a little heaven (i.e. a little of the "ideal") into that part of your life? **Respond** Begin to recognize your groaning to become the more heavenly version of yourself. Ask God to make you sensitive to the groaning of others (and even creation itself). Remind yourself daily: Creation is eagerly waiting for me to live as the child of God I truly am."

Pray "Heavenly Father, forgive me for the ways I distract myself from my deep longing to become all you created me to be. Teach me to listen to the longing within myself, to the cries of others, and to the groaning of all creation. Amen."

2. ON EARTH AS IT IS IN HEAVEN "AS IN HEAVEN, ALSO ON THE EARTH" (MATT. 6:10C; GREEK) POINTS US TO OUR **PURPOSE**.

Read

Genesis 1:1-2; 1:27-28; 2:15 Christ has no body now but yours, no hands, no feet on earth but yours. (Teresa of Ávila)

Reflect

- Why doesn't God finish what He started?
- Has He finished yet?
- How does He plan to finish what He started?
- What is our original human vocation?

Respond Each morning, this week, as you use your compass (i.e. Lord's Prayer) to point yourself in the right direction, pause and remind yourself:

God created me to partner with Him in the beautification of all creation — starting with the lump of clay staring back at me in the mirror.

Pray "Heavenly Father, renew my sense of purpose. Teach me how to live into my original vocation, this week. Amen."

3. ON MONDAY AS IT IS IN HEAVEN "AS IN HEAVEN, ALSO ON..." (MATT. 6:10C; GREEK) CALLS US TO **ACTION**.

Read

Ephesians 2:10

The church exists...not to provide an escape from the world's troubles but to colonize the earth with the life of heaven. (N.T. Wright, Simply Christian)

The Gospel is less about how to get into the Kingdom of Heaven after you die, and more about how to live in the Kingdom of Heaven before you die. (Dallas Willard)

Reflect

- Imagine your life fully colonized by the life of heaven. What would be different?
- Imagine our world fully colonized by the life of heaven. What would that look like?
- What small but significant step will you take this week to move your life and world that direction?

Respond

Choose one specific way you will bring heaven into a part of your life this week? (e.g. thoughts/words/deeds/relationships/calendars/budgets/church/town) Write it down. Share it with someone. Pray it daily.

Pray

"Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name. Thy Kingdom come — through me — on earth — this week. Thy will be done — in me — through Christ — this week. May my 'real' move closer to Your 'ideal.' as You empower me to live the life of heaven now. Amen."

"Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven" means: Help us to reject our own wills and to obey Your will without question. Your will alone is good. Help us carry out the work we are called to as willingly and faithfully as the angels in heaven. May we do this until Your kingdom fully comes, when You will be all in all.
