**Sermon** In the Dust of Our Rabbi

Sermon by: Pastor Ben Banner Matthew 4:19–20; Matthew 14:28

Main Idea:

Jesus doesn't just ask us to believe in Him — He invites us to follow Him. Discipleship means walking closely with Him, imitating His way, and becoming covered in the "dust" of our Rabbi.

#### 1. The Preposterous Invitation

Jesus calls ordinary people — fishermen, tax collectors, outsiders — to follow Him. Unlike other rabbis, Jesus shows His belief in us before we believe in Him.

#### Read

Matthew 4:19–20 — "Come, follow me... at once they left their nets and followed him." Quote: "Before Peter ever believed in Jesus, Jesus showed that He believed in Peter."

#### Reflect

Meditate on the fact that Jesus chose ordinary people to carry out His mission.

Pray: "Lord, thank You that You call me, not because of my greatness, but because of Your grace."

#### Respond

- How does it change your view of yourself to know Jesus believes in you?
- What is one "net" you may need to leave behind in order to follow Him more closely?

## 2. The Purpose of Discipleship

Following a rabbi meant living so close that you would be covered in his dust — watching, listening, imitating. Discipleship is not just learning about Jesus but becoming like Jesus.

#### Read

Matthew 14:28–29 — "Lord, if it's you... tell me to come to you on the water."

Quote: "The goal is to become more and more like Jesus, even in impossible moments."

#### Reflect

Meditate on what it means to "walk in the steps of Jesus."

Pray: "Lord, make me bold enough to step out of the boat and walk where You lead."

#### Respond

- Where is Jesus asking you to step out in faith this week?
- How can you practically imitate something Jesus did in your words, actions, or priorities?

## 3. The Challenge for Us Today

Discipleship is not about fitting Jesus into our lives when convenient. It is about surrender — carrying our cross daily and living in step with our Rabbi.

#### Read

Luke 9:23 — "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me."

Quote: "True discipleship is costly, but it is also the path to true life."

#### Reflect

Meditate on what "daily" means in this verse — not once, but every single day.

Pray: "Lord, give me courage to follow You fully, even when it's costly."

#### Respond

- Where are you tempted to follow Jesus only when it's convenient?
- What one step can you take this week to draw closer, so that you are covered in the dust of your Rabbi?

For the Week Ahead

Read: Matthew 4:18-22; Matthew 14:22-33; Luke 9:23-25.

**Pray**: Ask Jesus to help you follow closely enough to be "covered in His dust."

Act: Choose one practice this week (time, relationship, habit) to realign with Jesus' way.
